

## Le WebQuest per celebrare la Giornata Europea delle Lingue



### Introduction:

Organise students into groups. Tell students that they are going to look at several webpages with information about European Day of Languages.

Ask students the following questions:

- How many languages do you speak?
- What do you know about the European Day of Languages?
- Do you usually celebrate this special day? If yes, how?

### Tasks:

#### 1. General Information about the European Day of Languages

You and the other members of your group are going to visit four different web links that contain information about the European Day of Languages. Find the information to answer the questions on the handout.

#### 2. Indigenous Languages in Europe

Go to the web links to find Information about the indigenous and minority languages in Europe and about the EU's multilingualism policy.

#### 3. European Language Facts

Now, look at the Infographic "20 things you might not know about Europe's Languages". Find the information you need to answer the questions.

#### 4. Daily life in another country

(Option 1) Go to the website and find the information you need to answer the questions.

(Option 2) Research daily life in a country and present it to the rest of your class in a media of your choice. Include information about routines, meals, school, and leisure activities.

#### 5. All the colours of the rainbow

Find an expression for each of the colours listed. Tell your expressions to the rest of the class and see if they understand the phrases. Use visuals and other resources to help clarify the meanings.
