

## Dialogue Making in Audacity

### OBJECTIVE

To help students improve their speaking and listening skills by creating and recording dialogues using Audacity.

### MATERIALS

Audacity software (can be downloaded for free from [audacityteam.org](http://audacityteam.org))

Computers or laptops with audio recording capabilities

A list of conversation prompts or scenarios for students to use in their dialogues



### PROCEDURE

**Introduction to Audacity:** Show students how to download and install Audacity, and demonstrate the basic features of the software.

**Preparation:** Provide students with a list of conversation prompts or scenarios for their dialogues. Have them work in pairs or small groups to come up with their dialogues, practicing their pronunciation and intonation.

**Recording the dialogues:** Have students use Audacity to record their dialogues. Encourage them to speak clearly and naturally, and to use appropriate intonation and pacing.

**Listening and analysis:** Play back the recordings of the dialogues and have students listen to their recordings. Have them analyse their pronunciation, intonation, and pacing and identify areas for improvement.

**Feedback and revision:** Provide students with feedback on their recordings and have them revise their dialogues as needed. Encourage them to listen to their revised recordings and compare their progress over time.

### ASSESSMENT

Observe students as they create and record their dialogues using Audacity.

Evaluate the final recordings they submit, giving feedback on pronunciation, intonation, and pacing.

### NOTE

This lesson plan can be adapted to meet the needs of different skill levels and ages.

It's important to provide a supportive and non-threatening environment for students to practice their speaking and listening skills, and to emphasize that making mistakes is a normal part of the learning process.
